



TAKE ME HOME, COUNTRY ROAD!

Member for Flinders Liz Penfold said a new way had been found to build roads cheaply.

A typographical error in the Port Lincoln Times, 5 June 2001, gave the cost of 15 kilometres of the Lock-Elliston road as \$1.75! The word 'million' should have followed the figures.

At least one eagle-eyed reader was somewhat scathing of the minute cost, a fact that was mentioned during a call to the electorate office.

"After June 2002 there will be about 20 kilometres left to be sealed of a road that the Labor Party said they would never seal," Mrs Penfold said.

She said the Lock-Elliston funding was in addition to funding to continue the widening of the Lincoln Highway.

"Both are new works, not works that have been announced previously.

"These successes, along with other road works, have encouraged people to look at what can be done in their district.

"My only regret is that it costs rather more than \$1.75 to seal a kilometre of road," Mrs Penfold said.
